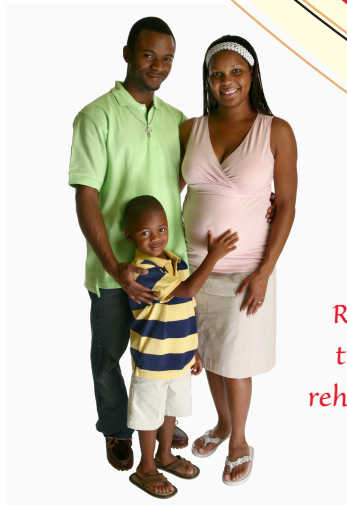
FUNDING

In 2008, River Region was awarded a Substance Abuse and Mental Health Administration (SAMHSA) grant to expand its specialised residential substance abuse treatment program for pregnant and postpartum women and their infants, children and families. The program provides residential treatment for pregnant and postpartum women for up to 12 months after giving birth.

The funding provides RRHS the opportunity to provide a full continuum of treatment for substance abusing pregnant and postpartum women, their children and significant others, which is a Family Disease Model approach to treatment. Once stable and able to transition from residential treatment, women are linked to stable housing as well as many social services and health providers that are in our network of care.

A Substance Abuse Treatment Program for Women, Children, and Families



What is WCFT?

WCFT is a program:

- which addresses the needs of women, their children and family members,
- that provides 3 - 4 months of residential treatment services,
- sponsored by SAMHSA Center for Substance Abuse Prevention.

Who qualifies:

- any woman who has given birth in the last 12 months,
- any pregnant woman,
- family members.

Who qualifies for residential treatment?

- Mother/pregnant female,
- Baby,
- Up to 2 children 10 years old or younger (with no serious medical conditions).

Who will be involved in treatment?

- Mother,
- Baby,
- Family Members,
- and Significant Others.

What services are provided?

- Individual Counseling
- Individualized Treatment Plan
- Group Counseling
- Family Counseling & Group
- Case Management
- Mental Health Counseling
- Tracking for medical services for women and children
- Prevention/Intervention for family members and other children
- Parenting Skills (Triple P)
- Family Strengthening and Reunification
